Horror Show At Loew's

An unusual and different type of horror epic is now showing at Loew's Victoria, 116th Street Theatres. Titled "Godzilla, King of the Monsters," the new science-fiction thriller is ready-made for audiences who recently saw the television revival of "King Kong."

"Godzilla," however, has taken advantage of the many new techniques available to the filmmakers since the birth of Kong. It is said to be the most realistic film of its type ever made.

Released by Toho Productions, the State's new attraction was filmed entirely in Japan. Raymond Burr, in the role of an American newspaper correspondent has the lead role and also handles the very effective narration entailed by the flashback method of continuity in "Godzilla."

While "Godzilla, King of the Monsters" has romance, pictorial value and suspense, nonetheless it is the composite photography and special effects that set it apart from other films of its genre.
